Dr. Jarvis is board certified in Pediatrics and board eligible in Pediatric Infectious Diseases. After two infectious disease fellowships, he went to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC). He was at CDC from 1980 to 2003 and during that time he held a number of leadership positions including Acting Director, Division of Healthcare Quality Promotion and Director, Office of Extramural Research, National Center for Infectious Diseases. He was Assistant Chief of the National Nosocomial Infections Surveillance (NNIS) system, the forerunner of the current National Healthcare Safety Network (NHSN). For 17 years, he was responsible for the supervision of all outbreak investigations, Guideline development and epidemiologic studies conducted by the Hospital Infections Program/Division of Healthcare Quality Promotion. He is the recipient of many awards, including the CDC Lifetime Achievement Award and the CDC Lifetime Achievement Award in Epidemiology. In 2003, he left CDC and started Jason and Jarvis Associates, LLC, a consulting company in infectious diseases, infection control and healthcare epidemiology. He consults nationally and internationally. He has >400 peer-reviewed publications and has edited 6 books, including the book, Hospital Infections.
