Bio- Professor Dale Fisher MBBS, FRACP

Professor Fisher is Senior Consultant in Infectious Diseases at the National University Hospital in Singapore. He has been Chair of infection control there for over 10 years as well being National Chair of IPC, for 5 years. Among NIPC's roles is forming guidelines for national implementation and also overseeing the results of hospital level key performance indicators in Singapore

He is originally from Australia and first worked in Singapore during the SARS outbreak in 2003. Adapting IPC principles in various countries and situations is crucial especially when evidence is unclear. As well as his experience in developed countries Prof Fisher has practiced IPC during international outbreaks in under resourced countries and also assists the WHO in guidelines development for infection control practices.

He has several national awards including in Australia, the RACP John Sands Medal and in Singapore a Courage Foundation Medal (SARS), PS21 ExCEL Award (Outstanding Activist), Pinnacle Excellence Award, National Clinical Excellence Team Award for infection control and a Healthcare Humanity Award. In 2018 he received the Minister for Health award for his contribution to IPC in Singapore.

He has over 160 publications in the peer reviewed literature and given over 70 invited plenary and keynote presentations.
