

BIOGRAPHY:

Jasper Fuk-Woo Chan is a Clinical Assistant Professor at the Department of Microbiology, The University of Hong Kong (HKU). He received his M.B.B.S from HKU in 2005, and completed postgraduate training at the Department of Medicine and Department of Microbiology at Queen Mary Hospital to become Fellow of the Royal College of Physicians of Edinburgh and Fellow of the Royal College of Pathologists of the United Kingdom. He joined the Department of Microbiology at his Alma Mater as an Honorary Assistant Professor in 2008 and a Clinical Assistant Professor in 2013. His research focuses on emerging respiratory viral infections and opportunistic infections in immunocompromised hosts. He has published over 95 research and review articles in international peer-reviewed journals including *Clinical Microbiology Reviews*, *Nature Communications*, *The Lancet*, and *The Lancet Infectious Diseases*. He is an associate editor of BMC Infectious Diseases and a regular reviewer for international peer-reviewed journals.

As a registered specialist in Clinical Microbiology & Infection in Hong Kong, Dr. Chan is experienced in the clinical and laboratory management of opportunistic infections in immunocompromised patients. He has been the designated clinical microbiologist to manage clinical and laboratory issues related to the hematopoietic stem cell transplant unit of Queen Mary Hospital since 2008. Besides research and clinical service, Dr. Chan has also been actively involved in the design and teaching of numerous undergraduate and postgraduate programmes at HKU, including the postgraduate diploma and certificate programmes in infectious diseases and infection control, and postgraduate specialist training in Internal Medicine and Clinical Microbiology.
