Dr Goh Kee Tai is Senior Consultant, Office of the Director of Medical Services, Ministry of Health (MOH). He is also Director of the WHO Collaborating Centre for Environmental Epidemiology (CCEE), MOH, and Adjunct Professor of the Saw Swee Hock School of Public Health, National University of Singapore. Dr Goh has been involved in epidemiological surveillance, teaching and research as well as in the formulation, implementation and evaluation of communicable disease prevention and control programmes in Singapore since 1975. He was head of the Quarantine and Epidemiology Department, Ministry of the Environment (ENV), until the epidemiological function of ENV was merged with that in MOH in April 2003. He has participated as WHO short-term consultant and temporary advisor in various regional and international projects and expert group meetings.

Dr Goh is the author of two monographs on surveillance of infectious diseases, published by the Southeast Asian Medical Information Center, Tokyo, in 1983 and 1992. He edited/co-edited 14 monographs published by the WHO CCEE, Singapore, and other collaborating institutions. He has also authored and co-authored more than 200 scientific papers published in local, regional and international medical journals. He has been editing the Epidemiological News Bulletin since 1975.

Dr Goh was awarded the Public Administration Medal (Bronze) in 1977, the Public Administration Medal (Silver) in 1984 and the Public Service Medal in 2007.
